SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING
CITY HALL, 108 W. 4TH STREET
June 26, 2013

At 7:00 P.M. Mayor Pro-Tem Foutch called the meeting to order. Those present were Council Members Crum, Johnson, Clark and Lefeber.

Agenda item 3 was to approve the agenda. Motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Clark to approve the agenda. 5 ayes.

Agenda item 4 was to approve closing 7th St. from Maple Ave. to 3rd Ave. on July 4th for the parade. Motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Crum to approve the closing for the parade route 7th St. from Maple to 3rd Ave. for the July 4th parade proceedings. 5 ayes.

Agenda item 5 was to approve closing 4th Ave. from 6th St. to 7th St. from July 3rd through July 6th. Motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Clark to close all of the street, 4th Ave. clear from 6th to 7th for July 3rd through the 6th. 5 ayes.

Agenda item 6 was to discuss Chief Smith's resignation. It is effective June 28, 2013. The city will proceed with hiring a new chief.

Agenda item 7 was to approve bid for cleaning services at Community Center, City Hall & Senior Citizen's Center. Motion was made by Clark and seconded by Crum to approve the bid for cleaning services for Keizer Detailing for the Community Center, City Hall and the Senior Citizen's Center for \$11,000 annually or \$423.08 biweekly. 5 ayes.

Agenda item 8 was to approve Resolution 13-14: A Resolution to enter into a contract with Keizer Detailing to perform cleaning services for the City of Logan Community Center located at 108 W. 4th Street in Logan, IA. Motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Clark to pass Resolution 13-14 for the contract with Keizer Detailing, perform cleaning services for the City of Logan Community Center located at 108 W. 4th St., City of Logan. 5 ayes.

Agenda item 9 was to approve Resolution 13-15: A Resolution setting salaries of city employees. Motion was made by Foutch and seconded by Crum to approve Resolution 13-15: A Resolution setting salaries of city employees. 5 ayes.

Agenda item 10 was to discuss getting a credit card for the city. The council held discussion and the deputy clerk will contact banks in the area for options.

Agenda item 11 was to discuss the Mayor Pro-Tem's recent actions. Lefeber discussed the Johnson's request for chickens from the May 20th council meeting, committee meeting procedures and the powers and duties of the Mayor Pro-Tem.

Agenda item 12 was citizen's questions and comments. Judy Dinkel discussed the qualifications of Vicki Schroder, and Jim Ertleman discussed veto powers in the state.
