

CITY OF LOGAN  
SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
CITY HALL, 108 W. 4<sup>TH</sup> STREET  
JULY 6, 2012

At 7:00 P.M. Mayor Fetter called the meeting to order. Those present were Council Members Clark, Johnson, Lefeber and Crum. Council Member Crum stated that he believed this meeting was illegal and wrong and that he wouldn't be a part of it. He thanked the citizens for coming and recused himself from the meeting.

The next item was to approve the agenda. Motion was made by Lefeber and seconded by Clark to approve the agenda. 3 ayes.

Item 4 on the agenda was to approve the termination of Angela Winther as City Clerk/Administrator. Johnson stated that they were saddened and alarmed with the recent discoveries, and they will be taking all of the necessary steps to correct the problems and protect the citizens' interests. Due to the nature of the information they obtained, which was communication between the city attorney and the city clerk, they will need to obtain further legal counsel before they can make public many of these communications. He said they will act as quickly as possible in securing the city's records and determining the next steps. He stated that he knew that many citizens had important things to say and opinions regarding this issue, and they will take those citizens' comments and questions at a future time. He said that was why the agenda was set up the way it was. Motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Lefeber to terminate the City Clerk, Angela Winther, for insubordination. Upon such termination she will immediately surrender all of her keys to the building, the clerk's office will be locked at the will of the council, and she will be immediately removed from the premises not to return until further notice. She will receive two weeks salary from the receipt of the written notice of this action. 3 ayes. Mayor Fetter said that Johnson had stated that there will be citizens' questions at the next meeting so citizens would be welcome to speak then.

Agenda item 5 was to approve the termination of Joseph Lauterbach as City Attorney. Motion was made by Johnson and seconded by Clark to terminate Joe Lauterbach as the City of Logan's attorney. Joe Lauterbach could not attend the meeting but had sent a letter addressed to the council for Mayor Fetter to read. This letter is on file with the minutes at City Hall. 3 ayes.

The meeting was adjourned.
