Agenda item 2 was Pledge of Allegiance.

Agenda item 3 was roll call. Those present were Council Members Cohrs and DeWitt and Mayor Foutch. Council Member Sporrer was absent.

Agenda item 4 was to approve the agenda. Motion was made by Cohrs and seconded by DeWitt to approve the agenda. 2 ayes.

Agenda item 6 was to discuss purchasing property at 107 N. 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The Council discussed this item further with the homeowner. They also discussed the possible purchase of this property by the Humane Society or a long-term lease. Council Member DeWitt will attend the next Humane Society meeting to find out if they may be interested in a long term lease.
